



Use of Funds 2019/20

Total Funds Distributed: \$1,000,000

Bolinas-Stinson Union School District: \$2,265.59

Bolinas-Stinson will use these funds to support the school library including the purchase of new books and to help students who cannot afford to purchase books during the annual book fair.

Miller Creek Elementary School District – Can Do! Education Foundation: \$53,783.59

Can Do Education Foundation will utilize these funds to sustain current Art programming at the three elementary schools. In addition, funding will be used to sustain counseling services at the middle school.

Kentfield School District – kik: \$32,727.10

Kentfield will use these funds for the new Strings Music Program at Kent Middle School and Makers Space at Bacich Elementary School.

Lagunitas School District – LEAP: \$6,173.37

LEAP will use these funds to support the Spanish and Music Program and Project Based Learning for 5th-8th grade.

Larkspur-Corte Madera School District – SPARK: \$41,386.91

SPARK will use these funds to further the support for English language learners and literacy support. In addition, funds will be allocated to materials and supplies for Music, Art and Counseling programs.

Mill Valley School District - Kiddo!: \$79,068.30

Kiddo! will use these funds to help pay for the Kindergarten dance program, extended library aide hours across the district, and the replacement of kilns for the art program.

Nicasio School District – Nicasio School Foundation: \$1,080.08

Nicasio will use these funds for technology upgrades.

Novato Unified School District - School Fuel: \$199,627.07

School Fuel will use these funds to fund a new partnership with the Marin Museum of Contemporary Art that will partner artists from the museum with each fifth grade classroom for a lesson and instruction, followed by a field trip to the museum and a show of student created works. These funds will also be used for elementary musical instruments, student and teacher grants supporting literacy, arts and technology.

Novato Charter School - \$7,269.82

Novato Charter School will use these funds to support Specialty Programs such as, Spanish, Organic Gardening, Music, Movement, and Handwork.

Reed School District – The Foundation for Reed Schools: \$36,351.06

Reed will use this money to fund innovation grants in the areas of technology, arts, health and literacy.

Ross School District – Ross School Foundation: \$10,541.42

Ross School will use these funds to support the music and arts programs through the purchasing of instruments, additional teacher support for specialized instruction in music, partnerships with non-profit organizations to provide students with musical performances that showcase multicultural dance, music, and theatre, as well as providing resources to support literacy in our music and arts programs.

Ross Valley School District – YES: \$55,614.16

YES will use these funds to fund and expand the STEAM Program including a district wide STEAMfest event. At the elementary level, funds will be used to purchase materials for "STEAM Fridays" and to host "Girls Ignite" workshops at each school. At the Middle School, funds will be used to purchase materials for the Inventor Lab and Digital Art classes as well as fund the teacher salary for those classes.

Ross Valley Charter School: \$4,273.44

Ross Valley Charter School will use these funds to support literacy programs and materials for the art program.

Rural School Districts & MCOE – Laguna, Lincoln, Marin Community School, Oracle Independent Study, Phoenix Academy: \$2,121.61

Funds will be used to support arts and technology programs.

San Rafael City Schools – HeadsUp: \$194,087.04

HeadsUp will use these funds to provide music for every 1st - 5th grade elementary student; after-school enrichment and peer support in the middle school; and music support, college consultants, an athletic academic advisor and extended library hours as well as health and wellness support at the high schools.

Sausalito Marin City School District- Bayside MLK: \$3,240.25

Sausalito Marin City will use these funds to further support the music and arts program at Bayside MLK.

Willow Creek Academy: \$10,521.17

Willow Creek will continue to use the funds to support the middle school Music in Society class.

Shoreline Unified School District: \$13,372.17

Shoreline will use these funds to support literacy programs K-8.

Tamaplais Union High School District: \$134,464.67 Total

- **The Drake Fund, \$34,858.14:** The Drake Fund will use the funds to support the Wellness Center operating budget, stipends for the mental health interns that work in the Wellness Center and program materials for the new SOAR (Students Organized for Anti-Racism) class as well as new equipment for the Fine Arts, Science and Applied Technology Departments.
- **Redwood High School Foundation, \$52,187.53:** Redwood will use these funds to provide resources to low income students, students of color and English Language Learners including the purchase of a translation system, loaner calculators and Chromebooks as well as support for community building activities and AVID program college visits.
- **Tam High Foundation, \$42,514.73:** Tam High Foundation will use these funds solely for equity initiatives that will ensure low income students are able to have equal access to school events and activities, including college application fees, experiential learning scholarships and Senior Class events.
- **Tamiscal and San Andreas, \$4,904.27:** Funds will be used towards professional development for staff on the topics of student wellness and wellbeing, equity, and anti-racist education.

Dedication to Special Education: \$112,031.23

Dedication to Special Education will use these funds to provide cutting edge education technology, student interventions and innovative classroom tools for special educators across school sites and districts countywide.
